

Oncidium lucianianum 'Sycamore Creek'

Thirty-three stellate flowers and 15 buds on one 96.5-cm, branched, upright-arched, staked, inflorescence; plant bearing five leafless pseudobulbs and five pseudobulbs bearing leaves grown in a 15.0-cm fine mesh plastic basket containing New Zealand Sphagnum moss; leaves two to three, oblanceolate, 27.0-cm long by up to 3.0-cm wide originating from the base of the pseudobulb, alternating with sheath like petiole, up to 10.0-cm, covering half of the pseudobulb, apical leaves oblanceolate; pseudobulbs pear shaped, compressed, 6.0 cm to 10.0 cm tall by 2.0 cm to 4.0 cm wide, newest bright green, older red-brown; sepals and petals oblanceolate, white, blotched purple-mahogany, margins undulate; lip white, side lobes blotched maroon perpendicular across the center; midlobe three fourths of the length, oblanceolate, base truncate, large heart shaped maroon blotch, smaller maroon blotches proximally and distally of large blotch, centrally lanulose, margin unevenly crenate, strongly undulate, crest white, raised as a plateau with a couple of peninsula's, sides lanulose; column white, slightly arched, ventral surface blotched maroon along proximal midvein, randomly surrounding stigmatic surface, dorsal surface blotched longitudinally along sides, column wings narrow terminating in caudae, blotched proximally; substance moderate; texture matte; country of origin is Columbia; award is provisional pending SITF confirmation; commended for attractiveness, rarity and novelty in cultivation.
