Per Jay Pfahl, www.orchidspecies.com, (ISOPE) describes this orchid species as "Mini-miniature sized, warm to cool growing epiphyte or lithophyte with a spreading short ramicaul enveloped by 3 to 7, leapanthiform sheaths and carrying a single, subapcial, coriaceous, obovate to oblanceolate, tridenticulate leaf that blooms at any time of the year on a terminal, .22 inches [6 mm] long, fractiflex, successively single to 8 flowered, racemose inflorescence."
